Question: 1

Which of the following color schemes is used in this artwork?

Answer: A

Question: 4

An MOV file is an Apple Quicktime Movie file. They are fairly large files and will have a higher quality than many other formats.

Question: 5

Which of the elements of art would best direct the viewer's eye when representing this road in an artwork?



- A. Color

Answer: B

Explanation:

The element of art, line, would best direct the viewer's eye when representing this road in an artwork. A line can be curvy, straight, wavy, broken, or even implied, so the road would not have to be outlined with a border; the lines could be implied. A line can be used to indicate movement in an artwork, and to lead a viewer's eye into the artwork, bringing them toward a focal point.

Question: 6

Which of the following is NOT an aim of video sculpture?

Video sculpture originated with artist Nam June Paik in 1963. It now allows performance artists to have a greater degree of permanence to their performances.

Question: 7

The main figure in the foreground is wearing red, which becomes the focal point of the artwork due to the color focus.

Question: 9

This painting is an example of which of the following painting techniques?

Answer: C

Explanation:

This painting is an example of tromp l'oeil, which means "to deceive the eye" in French. The painting is made to look realistic, as if they are actual objects on a wooden surface. The artist would have great skill and mastery of their media to create this optical illusion. Alla prima is a wet-on-wet technique, and plein air is when the artist paints outdoors. Sgraffito involves scratching through the surface of paint to reveal the surface underneath.

Question: 10

During which of the following artistic movements would this painting have been created?



- A. Neoclassical
- B. Mannerism
- C. Medieval
- D. Post-impressionism

Answer: A

Explanation:

This painting by French artist Jean Auguste Dominique Ingres is called Virgil Reading the Aeneid before Augustus, Octavia and Livia. This was painted in the Neoclassical style, which was a departure from the highly ornate Baroque style. Neoclassical artists were attempting to revive the subjects and styles of the Classical period, including Greek and Roman art.
